Neil Armstrong

Neil Armstrong was born on August 5, 1930 in Wapakoneta, Ohio. His love for flying started at a young age when his father took him to an air show.

Armstrong went to Purdue University and earned his bachelor's degree in aerospace engineering. He later got his masters degree at the University of Southern California. During college, Neil was called up by the Navy and became a fighter pilot.

After graduating from college, Armstrong became a test pilot. He flew all sorts of experimental planes, testing them out to see how well they flew. It was a dangerous job, but very exciting. He flew over 200 different types of aircraft during his career.

On December 23, 1968 Neil was offered the command of the Apollo 11. This would be the first manned landing on the Moon. After months of practice and preparation, the Apollo 11 spacecraft launched from Kennedy Space Center in Florida on July 16, 1969.

After landing, Armstrong was the first to leave the craft and walk on the Moon. The historic date was July 21, 1969. His famous words upon being the first man on the Moon were „*That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind*“. Buzz Aldrin also walked on the Moon during this trip. They collected Moon rocks and were on the Moon for over 21 hours. While the lunar module, named the Eagle, was
